Dear Sir,

The Education Authority understand that the land on the North side of the Badsey Council School buildings and school house is about to be offered for sale. As you are no doubt aware the Council School is getting overcrowded and it will be necessary for the Local Authority either to build further accommodation in Badsey or to build a new school in the Wickhamford District. If it should be decided to build in Badsey the land now said to be offered for sale would probably be regarded as a suitable site for the new school buildings. In any case it seems desirable that the Local Authority should have an opportunity of acquiring part of this land as a school site in case they should desire to build in Badsey.

Will you please let me know whether you are willing to make an offer of part of this land to the Local Authority for school purposes and whether such an offer might be kept open for a few weeks until the Local Authority have had time to consider the position.
