Frederick Orton.

This is the last Will and Testament of me
Frederick Orton, of Badsey, in the county of
Worcester, coal merchant. I give the sum of
one hundred pounds and the whole of my
household furniture in Badsey to Thomas
John Sears, of Badsey aforesaid, market-
gardener. I give the sum of one hundred
pounds to Sarah Willis, the wife of Albert
Willis, of 24 Purcell Crescent, Fulham, London.
I give to William Smith, of 25, Albany Street,
Miskin, Mountain Ash, South Wales, the sum
of fifty pounds. The residue of my estate and
effects real and personal which I may die
possessed of or entitled to I devise and bequeath
to my sisters Emma and Rose Margaret and my
brother Albert, all of Fillingley, in the county of
Warwick, in equal shares absolutely. I appoint
Albert Willis, of 24, Purcell Crescent, Fulham, Lon-
don, and William Smith, of 25, Albany Street,
Miskin, Mountain Ash, South Wales, executors
of this my last Will and Testament, and I
hereby revoke all former wills and codicils.
Dated this eighteenth day of October in the year
of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and
ten.
