George received his award from Mrs Barbara Jerram at The Badsey Society's tenth Annual General Meeting on Friday 17th February when a record number of over 60 members were present. The outgoing Chairman, Mike Lovatt, said that, over the years, George has built up one of the strongest community hubs a village could have. This is quite simply due to George's unfailing cheerfulness and willingness to talk to everyone as if he had known them for years. He said that you always felt better coming out of George's shop than when you went in - although you might have slightly less money! George regularly supports local causes, makes generous donations and raffle prizes; he also runs a martial arts class in the Village Hall for youngsters. The Chairman's sentiments were echoed by one of the people who nominated George: "The shop is an asset to the village - and George is the shop's biggest asset. George is consistent in his approach to customers and everyone is assured a warm welcome. He engages with all his customers, from the youngest child to the oldest pensioner. He remembers the smallest of details, enabling him to have interesting conversations with one and all. On some days, George may well be the only person to converse with some of our more reticent residents. Without George our village would be poorer. He has the capacity to brighten our day; he is proof that one person can make a difference." The Chairman concluded by saying, "Thanks George, on behalf of Badsey and Aldington people, and many from further afield I am sure; it couldn't happen to a nicer chap."



The Gordon Russell Design Museum

Opened in 2008 by Sir Terence Conran, who is an admirer of the late Sir Gordon's design principles and work, the Museum is receiving much acclaim for its modern design and welcoming volunteer staff.

The factory operated on the Broadway site up to the year 2000 and, at its peak, employed around 250 local people. It was founded on the design ideas embodied in the Arts and Crafts movement but with the object of adapting much of the manual work to the use of modern machinery.

With exhibits from the 1920's to the 1980's, including examples of the vital work undertaken during and after the 2nd World War, craftsmanship at its highest level is displayed in a contemporary setting.

Starting in March 2012, the Museum will be featuring different examples of interesting art and design work in a rolling programme of exhibitions housed in the first floor gallery.

Parish Council News FEBRUARY MEETING

The February Council meeting was attended by Gill Collin, the outgoing head of housing and planning at Wychavon District Council. Ms Collin addressed the Council on how the delegated powers system works in relation to planning applications, what constitutes relevant planning matters when submitting comment on planning applications and the role of the Parish Council in relation to planning applications and enforcement. Relevant matters which will be taken into account in respect of comments on planning applications include privacy of existing properties, adverse effect on living conditions, traffic impact, impact on listed buildings and poor design.

However, she stressed that the possible effect on the value of neighbouring properties, loss of a private view, internal layout (other than for listed buildings) and private property disputes (e.g. as to the existence of rights of way) are not planning matters. A number of Councillors and members of the public were able to ask questions and matters raised included enforcement and the importance of WDC reporting back to those who have raised enforcement issues, the method of classification of villages (and in particular why Badsey is classed as Category 1), the importance of neighbourhood planning and the New Homes Bonus. As a result of Ms Collin's visit the question of the Parish Council's policy on enforcement of planning conditions was placed on the March agenda.

Other matters discussed in February included a request to Worcestershire Highways to undertake a traffic survey in the centre of Badsey so as to help build up a picture of traffic changes year on year,

a proposal that the new development on Brewers Lane should be named 'Fothersway' and the appointment of a working party to consider the Government's request for comments on Allocation of Accommodation (Social Housing).

STREET LIGHTING

All the footway lights have recently been inspected with no major problems found.

RESIDENTS' COMMENTS

Many thanks to those residents who have recently raised issues of concern, made proposals for future improvements in the Parish and responded to requests for proposals for use of the New Homes Bonus. Such feedback helps the Council in many ways and it is greatly appreciated.

FUTURE MEETINGS

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Wednesday, 18th April 2012. It is anticipated that there will be a Planning Committee meeting on the same evening.

100 Years Ago – From Badsey (with Aldington) and Wickhamford Parochial Magazine. April 1912

This issue was primarily concerned with church matters, with details of the times of Easter services and the Easter Vestry meeting. It was noted that "On Good Friday the offerings at Badsey will be divided between the Bishop in Jerusalem's fund and Church expenses." It also contained a report of the Conference of the Evesham Deanery when it was resolved "that this conference is resolutely opposed to the disestablishment disendowment of the Church in Wales as being unjust and dishonourable to the Nation, hostile to the cause of true religion, and a serious hindrance to the work of Christian people in Wales."
