SDITFIRE SDECTACULAR FOR FLOWER SHOW

The 110th Badsey Flower Show takes place on Saturday 21st July 2012 on the Recreation Ground, Sands Lane.

Highlight of the show this year will be a flypast display by an original WWII Spitfire from the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight.

This follows on from last year's show where the Red Arrows display team were at the event.

The 2012 Badsey Flower Show will also include a professional stunt dogs display, musical theatre by Vital Statistics Theatre Company, a dance display by a troupe of Morris Men, a fun dog show, a static birds of prey display, the Celebration Reed Band, a large marquee of exhibits plus, stalls, side shows, kid's rides and games and a variety of food and drink.

Committee Member, Adrian Barradell explains, "Last year we had the Red Arrows and a fly past by a vintage Dakota aeroplane. This was a huge hit so this year we have something truly special with a flypast by one of the few remaining and flying Spitfires. This will give us a rare chance to see one of these truly iconic machines in flight.

"Down on the ground we will have the usual mix of professional and amateur entertainment plus a wide mix of stalls and side shows.

"So put the date in your diary now and come and take part in this fun day."

Gates open at 1pm. Entrance costs £3 (or £1 for kids and £2 for OAP'S). The event ends at 5pm.

Dear All.

Ne'er cast a clout till May be out. I am sure that you have all heard this warning, and in essence it means do not discard your warm winter clothing until May is out. It is an old English proverb which appears to date back to around the 1700's, and since the early fifteenth century 'clout' has been used to mean variously a bang on the head; a clod of earth; or a fragment of cloth or clothing. In this context, therefore, it is our warm winter clothing that should not be discarded; from the wonderful temperatures in late February to the cold of early April, it is a good warning to heed.

But, when will 'May be out?' and here in lies something of a controversy. Is May the month of May or does it mean something different? I think that I prefer the interpretation that 'May be out' refers to the Hawthorn bush (also known as the May bush and its blossom known as May). Miles of

hawthorn bushes (or trees) were planted as part of the Enclosure Acts in the late 18th century and the English countryside is full of wonderful hawthorn hedges which come into blossom in late April or early May.

Using this analogy 'till May be out' could mean until the May Tree or Hawthorn is in full blossom. Hawthorn has also been seen as symbolising new birth and fertility for centuries, probably because of its flowering in early spring. The exact date for the 'May to be out' however is something of a moveable feast depending on the weather, which fits in well with the opening proverb 'Ne'er cast a clout till May be out'. So on the matter of whether we need to wait until this month is out or if we need to look to the hedgerows to decide when to switch to our summer clothes I think to jury is still out.

From a church perspective we will be celebrating Rogation on the 13 May this year at 11.00am at Bretforton (when we will be joined by Bretforton Silver Band). This is the time in the church year that we give thanks for all that God provides for us and pray for a blessing on the crops of the coming year, another symbol of birth and fertility. The decision to wear summer or winter clothes is yours - but I suggest you bring a coat!!

Our members organised a Lent Lunch in each of our three churches. We had tasty home made soup in a variety of flavours and rolls provided by Tesco. A total of £151 was raised for Mothers Union Overseas Fund.

In 83 countries around the world, Mothers' Union members are involved in a wide range of community projects, ranging from running small scale farming initiatives in Uganda, to setting up family support groups in prisons around the UK. The key element of any of our work is that it brings about a strengthening of family life - whether through increasing relationship or parenting skills, skills to enable them to overcome poverty, or provision of need to them at a stressful time.

Whatever the needs of families or communities, Mothers' Union is willing to help. In developing countries our members run workshops to raise awareness of health issues and improve skills; they organise income-generating projects in farming or craft production and they work to support families affected by HIV/AIDS.

Communities in three African countries are being changed because of Mothers' Union's Literacy and Financial Education Programme. To date over 70,000 women and men have achieved an accredited qualification in literacy learning across Burundi, Malawi and Sudan, and the programme has now expanded its field of expertise from literacy and numeracy skills to include financial and small business skills education.

Badsey Mothers' Union thanks all members who provided soup and helped at the three churches, Tesco for the rolls and a special Thank you goes to all who attended the lunches and provided funds for these and many more worthwhile projects.




May I say a big thank you to all who helped at this craft morning without this help these events could not take place. Thank you.

Parish Council NewsRESIGNATION OF CLERK TO THE COUNCIL

With considerable regret the Clerk has decided to resign from her position as Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer to the Council, because of pressure of other work. She has greatly enjoyed her position and is sorry that she cannot continue. However, she will continue in post for the time being in order to ensure a smooth handover to her successor. Please watch the notice boards and the Worcestershire County Council 'My Parish' webpage for Badsey for details of the new Clerk, who it is hoped will be appointed in the near future.

NEW HOMES BONUS

As mentioned in a previous edition of the News, as a result of Wychavon District Council's decision to pass on part of the New Homes Bonus which they receive from the Government the Council is in a position to access funds of more than £19,000 a year for the next 6 years for 'community' projects. A number of possible projects have already been mooted but the Council has decided that because of the relatively substantial funds available a public meeting will be called which can be attended by local residents and organisations with a view to gathering the widest possible views. Please watch the notice boards for details of this meeting.

MARCH MEETING

In addition to considering the resignation of the Clerk and the New Homes Bonus the Council appointed GBD Evesham Ltd as the grass cutting contractor for the Recreation Ground for 2012-2014, authorised the Clerk to request Prysmian to complete the identified works to the footway lighting

and raised further questions for consideration before the Council can decide whether or not to join the WCC Parish Lighting Scheme. Following the presentation by Gill Collin from WDC (reported in last month's Community News) the Council also decided to place on the agenda for the April meeting the question of what the Parish Council's policy should be in relation to reporting breaches of conditions attached to consent to planning. By the time you read this the outcome of that discussion should be reported in the Minutes for the April meeting which will be displayed on the notice boards.

FUTURE MEETINGS

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Wednesday, 16th May 2012. Please note that this will also be the date for the Annual Meeting of Electors of the Parish and for the Annual Parish Council meeting. It is therefore anticipated that there will be NO Planning Committee meeting that evening. Please watch the notice boards for details of the date and time of any Planning Committee meetings in May.

Parish Magazines of Yesteryear

Many congratulations to 17-year-old Alice Morrey who has taken over the reins as Editor of Community News. Alice must surely be the youngest Editor ever to produce Badsey's Parish Magazine and she should be proud of her first edition.

The Badsey Society's archive team is still at work on the old Parish Magazines, extracting information to act as keywords for the new website which is being launched later this year. Trevor Hockenhull is looking at the earliest magazines and sends us information about the death of Mrs Elizabeth Evans, who died a hundred years ago. Descendants of Mrs Evans still live in the village today.

100 Years Ago – From Badsey (with Aldington) and Wickhamford Parochial Magazine, May 1912

The sudden death of Mrs Evans on Saturday, March 30, came as a painful surprise to everybody. On the previous evening she was apparently in her usual health, and it was difficult to realise that she had passed away. The funeral took place on the following Tuesday, the first part of the service being held at Badsey Church where she had been a regular worshipper for 20 years, and the interment taking place at Bengeworth Cemetery where Mrs
