The Society of Dyers and Fullers was founded in 1363 and is the oldest of the seven medieval guilds in London. It was responsible for the regulation of the dyeing and fulling trades in the City of London. The Society's members were responsible for the maintenance of the River Thames and the City's water supply.

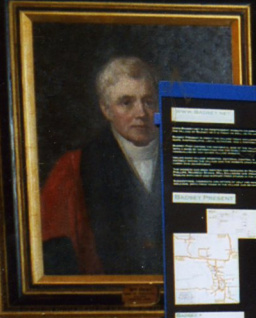

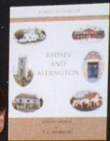
MEMBERSHIP

Badsey and the Railway
 The Badsey Railway Station was opened in 1862 and was one of the first stations in the area. It was built by the Great Northern Railway Company and was used for many years as a passenger station. The station was closed in 1964 and the building was demolished in 1970. The site is now a car park.
