

At our meeting in May we discussed the resolution that the National Federation of Women's Institutes has decided to campaign the Government for in 2012.

This is for the training and employment for more midwives. The birth rate has gone up considerably in the last few years but the number of midwives has not.

Currently in Worcestershire alone the average of the births to midwives is 29 births for every one midwife. This means that pregnant mums and mums in labour are not getting the care and attention they should. 27% of midwives say they do not have time to really get to know pregnant mums or have enough time to talk to them. 25% of mums in labour are left for very long periods without a midwife and some go through the whole labour process without a midwife. After care is virtually non-existent. More and more women of 40 plus are having babies, many needing extra care and vigilance.

A number of obese women and women with illnesses such as diabetes, high blood pressure etc., are also having babies and they also need careful monitoring and attention. In Scotland and Ireland pregnant mums are well supported and their ratio is 9 births to one midwife. Badsey W.I. voted for this resolution to be carried.

After the resolution discussion we enjoyed a social time of a tombola, with good prizes and a "What is it" quiz with 20 small bags containing items which had to be felt to decide what was in them. A good game with the winners receiving a box of chocolates.

The skittles team won their final match in the Federation competition and now go through to the semi final to be played at Lower Broadheath on 17th May.

Members also brought along items of food stuffs, toiletries etc. for Caring Hands in the Vale. A wonderful organisation doing so much to help those who need it in these difficult times.

Our next meeting on Wednesday June 13th will be our Garden Meeting at the home of Marianne and Chris Beddis. The evening to have a red, white and blue theme. Anyone interested in coming along to pay us a visit is welcome. We meet on the second Wednesday of each month at the Village Hall at 7.15.pm.

In this present climate people are losing jobs or having their hours cut causing great financial hardships and of course there are other reasons why some people fall on hard times. We can help by putting the odd tin of food, some toothpaste, tights, socks, dried foods etc. in the 'bin' when we can. Please help those less fortunate than ourselves by giving what you can for this most worthy cause. You may even be helping someone from your own village.

FALSE: Some people are under the misapprehension that so called "scroungers" etc. will jump on the bandwagon to get 'free food'. NOT true. People have to have a referral letter from one of the above bodies to obtain a food parcel etc. Alcohol, money, tobacco and aerosols are never given out and people cannot just go and ask for food etc.
