There was another very early start on Monday as it was time to say goodbye to everyone, we all agreed we had a lovely time and are looking forward to keeping the contact going.

² Letter For The Month

Dear All

This is my first letter as a newly ordained Priest in the Church of England, having been ordained by Bishop John of Worcester in Worcester Cathedral on July 1st. I am also entering my second year as Assistant Curate to the benefice of Badsey with Aldington, Offenham and Bretforton. But what does this actually mean? Richard Court is the Vicar of the Benefice and has overall responsibility for the three parish churches and the "cure of the souls" of those who live in the parishes. In other words he is "The Vicar" and I am training under his excellent guid-This training, as Assistant Curate, is for a ance. minimum of three years. In addition to working and learning alongside Richard, my training incumbent, I am expected to attend Curates training once a month and a weekend once a year.

The clerical structure within the Church of England can be seen as quite complex but there are only three levels of ordination: deacon, priest and bishop. Normally a newly ordained deacon serves for a year during which time they prepare themselves for priesthood with a particular emphasis on presiding at the Eucharist or Holy Communion when

Christians come to the Lord's table to remember how and why Jesus gave his body to be broken on the cross and shed his blood for the forgiveness of sin. Deacons however can baptise and take funerals.

When someone is ordained priest they can then carry out all the duties authorised to them by the Church of England including presiding at Eucharist, marrying couples, absolving people of their sins after confession and blessing in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The majority of clergy remain as priests but a chosen few go on to become Bishops who have authority to ordain deacons and priests as well as authorising other ministries, as well as confirming new Christians who choose to come to Christ through confirmation.

As a female priest I am fully in favour of women becoming Bishops since it is a natural progression from the acceptance of ordaining women priests. However there is a minority within the Church of England who cannot accept such ministry and in true Christian style the Church is trying to find a way forward to accommodate them. Whilst the majority, are feeling very frustrated, and in some cases quite angry, that the whole process has been put on hold for a few more months Richard and I recognise we still need to hold the significant minorities thoughts and feelings in prayer. I am sure that in due course we will see God at work in the ordination of our first woman Bishop.

Thank you for all your love and support. I feel a very blessed priest.



On Your Marks






