

# 110th Annual Badsey Flower Show



The BBMF is proud to be the operator of six Spitfires, ranging from a 1940 MKIIa to its two 1945 built griffon-powered PRXIX Spitfires.

Probably the most famous of these six Spitfires is AB910, which is a MKVB Spitfire built at Castle Bromwich in 1941.

Whilst at RAF Hibaldstow on the 14th February 1945, AB910 became famous by flying WAF Margaret Horton on its tail, on a circuit of the airfield. It was standard practice in rough weather to sit on the wings or tail, but it was best to get off as I found out many times before take off in the 1940's.

The pilot was FIt Lt Neil Cox DFC + Bar and it was a miracle that Margaret stayed on during the flight. FIt Lt Cox's skill enabled a very frightened WAAF to stagger to the canteen for a very stiff drink.

The Spitfire that thrilled us all at our Flower Show on Saturday 21st July was this very same original aircraft that was built in 1941.

AB910 did us all proud, thanks for the memory. *Michael J. Barnard*

#### **2 Letter For The Month**

Dear All,

As I write this letter for the magazine we have exceeded our Medal total at the Olympic Games over the Medals won at Beijing in 2008 a target set by Team GB before the Olympics started something truly to be celebrated.

Over the past few months we have seen the Queen travelling round the country in celebration of her Diamond Jubilee and the Olympic Torch make its way around the country. I was lucky enough to see the torch in Wickhamford and I know many others saw it locally (and some further afield), this was followed with, what for me, was a wonderful opening ceremony of the Olympic Games. All of these events had elements of a pilgrimage in them - the Queens Jubilee and the Olympic Torch are easy to understand as a pilgrimage because they both travelled around the country very much like we would expect of a pilgrimage – or a journey. The Opening Ceremony of the Olympics may be less obvious – but it was nevertheless a journey - or pilgrimage through British history. The Olympics cannot by any stretch

a 'religious event' but there was an exploration of our spiritual roots during the opening ceremony with the singing of 'Jerusalem', 'Danny Boy' 'Flower of Scotland' and 'Guide me O thou Great Redeemer' - not the mention all eight verses of 'Abide with Me'. Pilgrimage is something practised or recommended by most of the major world faiths and Christians for centuries have made pilgrimages - following in the steps of saints before them. As I mentioned earlier the Games cannot in any way be seen as a 'religious event', but there are interesting connections that can be made. Did you know for instance The Olympic Motto - Swifter(or faster), Higher, Stronger, came originally from a Dominican French Priest who promoted sport as the main principal of his Church School (he used it in a slightly different order faster, stronger, higher); and the phrase about 'not the winning but the taking part' came from a sermon by the then Bishop of Central Pennsylvania at St Paul's Cathedral during the first week of the games in July 1908 while there was great tension between the Americans and British during the first week of the games in London. Perhaps there is therefore a bigger connection between the games and religion than you first think and that perhaps we are not such a 'secular society' as some would have you believe.

Each of our Olympians (and those from around the globe) are on their own journey (or pilgrimage) striving to do the best they can do, part of our Christian heritage is that we too always need to strive to do the best we can; let us hope and pray that one legacy of the Olympics is our continual striving to do the best we can.

#### BADSEY GUIDE LEADED *DECEIVES MBE*

Elizabeth Bolland of Binyon Close was awarded the MBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours List. Elizabeth, or Captain to many of us in Badsey and the surrounding area, has devoted most of her life, or nearly 60 years of it, to the Girl Guiding movement. From being a Brownie at the age of seven, then a Girl Guide, Elizabeth has been Guide Leader of Badsey for over 34 years, Guide District Commissioner, Guide Division Commissioner, Ranger Leader and Rainbows Leader as well as many other roles within the Guiding movement. Unfortunately, due to the rules of guiding, Elizabeth had to retire from being a Leader of Badsey Guides when she reached the young age of 65. This must have been very disappointing for her and was certainly a loss to Badsey Girl Guides. However, not withstanding, Elizabeth has taken on other roles within the movement that are allowed after the age of 65 and is Division Guiding Development Adviser, District Assistant, County Mentor to new Leaders in training, Mentor to new Commissioners both for the Division and the District and is involved in many other aspects of Guiding. Elizabeth started the Trefoil Guild for the Evesham and Pershore area of which she is Chairman. Several of us who have been with "Captain" in the past are proud to be members of this Guild under her leadership which makes it just 'like old times'. Many, many tales could be told of the fun, laughter, mishaps, adventures etc., we have had with Elizabeth as Guide Captain and I am sure many of you reading this article would have a tale to tell, especially 'camping stories'. Many of us will also be more than grateful for her enthusiasm; drive and imagination which have helped shape the characters of so many of our daughters and other girls. Asked how she felt being awarded the MBE, she replied "Honoured, very surprised, totally unexpected but absolutely delighted that Girl guiding has been recognised". Then asked what she liked best about guiding and what she gets out of it replied ' To be able to give girls and young women the opportunity to learn new skills, enjoy a diverse



range of activities, have fun and to see them develop into useful members of the community. After nearly 60 years since I became a Brownie, I still enjoy organising and participating in events for all ages, thoroughly enjoying mentoring new Leaders and I appreciate the way Girl guiding UK has moved forward to meet the needs of new generations'. We applaud and thank you Elizabeth not just for your MBE but for your devotion, dedication and enthusiasm for the youth of yesterday and today.

#### Games Maker: Maureen Spinks

Friday 10th August – I have just returned to Badsey from a most amazing fortnight in London. Since the start of the Olympic Games, I have been working at Horse Guards Parade as a "Games Maker" volunteer. As many of you will know, Horse Guards Parade has been transformed into a beach volleyball arena for the duration of the Games. Located almost on the Prime Minister's doorstep in central London, it provides an iconic location for the competition, and certainly has the "Wow!" factor when spectators arrive for the first time. From the arena, you can see the London Eye, Big Ben, The Shard, and just about every government building of importance. I've lost count of the number of times I have been asked by people to take photos of them set against the magnificent backdrop of Whitehall. A bonus one evening was the sight of a full moon rising through the London Eye.

Dressed in our distinctive regal purple and poppy red uniform (inspired by the Grenadier Guards uniform), the aim was for volunteers to stand out in the crowd. My main duties were either scanning tickets or showing people to their seats. It was amazing how late some people arrived, and I was normally showing people to their seats for at least a good hour after the game had started. It was a

long way up to some of the seats and, of one occasion, I had a lady who suffered from vertigo, so I had to arrange for her to be reseated. Prince Harry was there for the women's final, as was David Beckham, but I only caught fleeting glances of them.

During the first week, when there were preliminary round beach volleyball sessions at 9 am, 2.30 pm and 7.30 pm, I worked either from 6.15am—4pm or 2.30pm—12.30am. By the second week, when the quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals were on, the shifts were not so long as there were not so many sessions. I was fortunate that I was able to stay with my sister who lives in West Kensington, which was only seven stops on the tube.

It wasn't all work, though, as we were given days off. The Spinks family had been lucky enough to get tickets to basketball, beach volleyball and table tennis, so Tony and Jonathan joined me in London for a few days. We very much enjoyed our visit to the Olympic Park and the Excel Arena, and I also appreciated being able to attend Horse Guards Parade as a spectator. There were also free events to go to: I joined the crowds lining Hyde Park to watch the triathletes whizz past on their bikes, and



then next day went to the Serpentine to watch the 10 km swim. Plus there are also several exhibitions to go to relating to the Olympics.

There has been a real buzz in London during the course of the Games. People talk to each other in the tube, in queues, in restaurants, and everyone has taken great pride in being British and celebrating our athletes' pride in being British and celebrating our athletes' successes. If you haven't had a chance to soak up some of the Olympics atmosphere, it is well worth considering trying to get some tickets for the Paralympic Games, if still available.
