I was selected to be a Team Leader for Event Services at the superb Olympic Stadium. My role was to look after the welfare and manage a group of Gamesmakers in certain roles. (Basically I had a clipboard and a radio)! I'd get to the stadium each day for my shift and after a briefing I would be allocated an area to supervise...which could be the Information booths, concourse, entrance bridges (lots of scanning of tickets) or the Seating areas (most sought after). I would then go to my area and would meet my cheery band of Gamesmakers for that day. I'd allocate them their jobs and then supervise them and look after their welfare, and help them with any problems.

Every day it was new faces with whom you had to build up a rapport and trust very quickly, and they were all superb and up for some fun as well as hard work. Luckily I had seating area for the last two nights, so watched Oscar Pistorius win the 400m on the Saturday night (I was right behind the flags as they were being raised) and watched a Coldplay concert, I mean the Closing Ceremony as well! That night when the crowd gave us a standing ovation was just too emotional for words. I was at the top entrance with two gamesmakers, a 70 year old London lady (they come in all ages)

and a 24 year old student nurse...and we just hugged and sobbed as about 7500 people in our sector applauded us... truly humbling. None of us did it for recognition or to watch the sport. We did it because we wanted to be involved in something very special, and it was something that I will never see in my lifetime again and I feel proud to have done it. I now have one used uniform but endless memories of a wonderful time that I will never forget.

Bring on Rio!!

Badsey W.I





Jams For Church

It is just a year ago when someone had the idea of putting a box containing jam, chutney and marmalade in Church. The hope was that it would sell and that it would bring people who normally do not attend regular Church services into Church to buy it. The extra money would be useful but it was more important that people felt comfortable popping into Church.

Hilary Bolton provided the first batch of jams, and spicy sauces and marmalade and chutney were added so a good selection was maintained in the very eye-catching box.

The idea has proved very successful and so this article is a big 'thank you' not only to the people who made the jams but even more to the people who supported the idea and bought the goodies, and were then kind enough to return the empty jars to Church for re-use. Someone even donated a couple of packs of the cellophane tops which was gratefully received as every little helps. Thank you all very much.

Last year we had plenty of fruit to use but harvests do not look so good this year thanks to the very wet weather and the late frost in the Spring so apples are going to be in short supply along with other crops, but please continue to support the idea, and if anyone would like to be a contributor to the box anything would be welcome such as pickled onions, pickled cabbage, whatever you like – the more the merrier and ready for Christmas!

Beetroot & Ginger Chutney

Ingredients

500g/1lb 2oz fresh beetroot, peeled, finely chopped 1kg/2lb 2oz cooking apples, peeled, quartered, cored, roughly chopped

275g/10oz red onion, finely chopped 2.5cm/1in piece fresh ginger, peeled, grated 75g/2½oz crystallised stem ginger, finely chopped 350g/12oz soft light brown sugar 2 tsp Maldon salt, or 1 tsp table salt 1 tsp ground allspice 750ml/1 pint 7fl oz red wine vinegar

Preparation method

Place the beetroot, apple and red onion into a large pan.

Add the fresh ginger, crystallised ginger, brown sugar, salt and ground allspice.

Add the vinegar and stir to mix well.

Bring to the boil, then turn down the heat and simmer for approximately one hour, stirring every now and again, until the beetroot pieces are tender. Spoon into sterilised jars and seal. Keep refrigerated and use within four weeks.

Toilet And Kitchen Facilities

At its last meeting the Parochial Church Council unanimously agreed to go ahead with plans to provide a toilet and kitchen facilities in church. This has been something that has been ongoing for many years (certainly prior to my coming in 2005). At the moment we are in the process of producing plans to be submitted for approval and as soon as plans are drawn they will be on display for all to see as part of that process. The basis of the proposal so far is for a toilet to be installed in what is currently known as 'the vicar's vestry'; storage cupboards on the left hand side (as you look at the window) of the transept; and a sink and cupboards on the right had side. We also plan to install a new boiler and remove the current boiler house. Our plan is for all of this to be done in sympathy with the current interior of the church and to enhance the facilities we have to offer. Entrance into the transept will be made easier by the removal of the front pew on each side. As a separate proposal we are also planning to reduce the step into the church to make it easier for disabled access. As more information becomes available it will be announced in the Community News and information left in church.
