

Fast Falls The Eventide



The title of this article is with acknowledgement to Dad's favourite Hymn, 'Abide With Me', the soldiers Hymn too.

My father - John Barnard, late of 'Packs House', Bretforton Road, Badsey.

My father's return to his home in Badsey after two years in France (1916-18) as a Battalion runner in the 2nd Worcestershire Regiment was so emotional that for many years he relived the horrors he experienced on the fields of Flanders by going 'over the top' continuously well into his twenties.

Being a market gardener before he was called up, his love of the fields of home was often told to me by Dad when we were in the peace and quiet of our plum orchards. A time that reminded him of the times when the guns fell silent, of the uncanny atmosphere of silence, only an occasional bark of a dog and the squelching of footsteps echoing through the waterlogged trenches.

There were many light-hearted moments thanks to the First World War cartoonist Bruce Bairnsfather, the creator of the moustached character 'Old Bill'. His drawings spoke volumes for the morale of soldiers that almost every night went 'over the top' across fields towards the enemy's barrage of withering fire. Bruce Bairnsfather spent the last few years of his life in a village near Malvern and it was here at Malvern that Dad died in a nursing home in 1987, so near to the creator of the soldiers best loved character 'Old Bill'.

On leaving Evesham Station on Dad's return from France and Belgium, he turned left on leaving the yard and started walking up Greenhill. He was so unwell that a kind person took charge and walked a short way up the hill with him, pointing Dad in the direction of Knowle Hill and Badsey.

Looking forwards' towards Badsey on the crown of Knowle Hill, Dad said 'I'm home and I shall never have to leave here again'.

He never did and like 'Old Bill' he had found a better 'Ole here at the bottom of the lane - Badsey.

2 Letter For The Month

Dear All.

This year our Service of Remembrance falls on Armistice Day the 11 November, the day on which the armistice between the Allies of World War I and Germany was signed at Compiègne, France, for the cessation of hostilities on the Western Front of World War I. The service will be organised by local members of the Royal British Legion, which was formed in 1921 to support the veterans of the Great War, and the annual poppy appeal will be, by now well under way. Preparations are also underway nationally for August 2014 when the world will mark the 100th anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War. Why should we remember? Why should we stop and think about those events that happened so long ago?

By the end of the First World War there were very few people in the countries that took part who remained unaffected. The war reached out and touched almost everyone's life in some way or other. Children grew up in the shadow of battle, their fathers absent or lost. Women became directly involved, picking up the pieces of industry and agriculture as the men went off to fight. By 1918, they too could join the army and serve their country. Men enlisted, or were called up, in their millions, being sent to fight in places that many had never heard of before. It was a global struggle. Life changed forever. Nothing was ever the same again.

A flavour of the effect on peoples lives was evident if you saw the recent film 'Warhorse'; I had the opportunity to see both the stage production in

London as well as the film version at the Regal in Evesham. I have to admit that I felt the stage play was more emotional but I think that was because of being so close to the actors, but nobody could fail to be affected by either production. Neither however could ever portray the effect of the power unleashed by the then 'modern warfare techniques' which resulted in previously unimagined losses. Over 9 million soldiers died as a result of the fighting. Food shortages, sometimes deliberately inflicted by blockade and sometimes resulting from failed harvests, weakened the people who remained on the home fronts. Nearly 6 million civilians died from disease or starvation. Almost 1 million more were killed as a direct result of military operations. In all, the estimate of the dead resulting from the war stands at over 16 million.

Going back to my original questions - Why should we remember? We need to remember because we all have relatives who were involved in one way or another and many of us have relatives who never returned. Why should we stop and think about those events that happened so long ago? So that with God's help we may be able to work together to stop such a monstrous thing happening again, unfortunately as I look at the conflicts raging around the world at the moment I fear that will never be the case. All we can do is pray for those involved in the current conflicts and give thanks for those who have already given their lives 'we will remember them'.






This month the anniversary competition was "Flowers", not only 'live flowers' but flowers in different guises.

Launch Of The Badsey Society's Latest DVD At The Regal Cinema

On the morning of Monday 1st October, over 150 people came together to view The Badsey Society's launch of its latest DVD, "The Market Gardener", at The Regal Cinema. Included amongst the guests were the Mayor of Evesham, Councillor Robert Raphael, and the Mayoress, Councillor Mrs Diana Raphael, and Wychavon Tourism Officer, Angela Tidmarsh.

The film, which was two years in the making, documents the life of market gardening families in the Vale of Evesham. With the aid of archive footage, interviews and old photographs, the result is an intriguing look at a way of life fast disappearing. The film was masterminded by Aldington-born Will Dallimore, who has been involved with the Society's previous films, and acted as director, editor and narrator for this production. Richard Phillips was the scriptwriter and Valerie Magan and John Dallimore assisted. The film includes several interviews with market gardeners and their families, including 88-year-old George Keen. One of the highlights of the film was the reading of a letter which the schoolboy George Keen had written in 1933 about life in a

market gardening community, when he was a pupil at Badsey Council School; this was one of a series of letters written for the BBC at the instigation of Sir John Russell of the Rothamsted Research Institute in Hertfordshire. Four pupils from Blackminster Middle School provided the voice-overs for the young letter-writers of 1933.

The late Tony Jerram, the first Chairman of The Badsey Society, first suggested the idea of making a film to document the decline in market gardening in the Vale of Evesham. His working title for the film, "The Last Market Gardener", was adopted by the Society for their Heritage Lottery funded project. However, the pessimism first envisaged has not entirely come to pass, so the word "Last" has been omitted from the film title.

The music used in the film was recorded by local quartet, Arioso Winds, which included two Badsey residents, Helen Green and Philippa Tennant. The production of the film has been made possible by means of a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund. Copies of the DVD are available at The Spar, price £6.
