


Elizabeth Bolland MBE

Everyone is invited to this service, where the children will have the candles lit on their Christingle orange. The collection at this service will be given to The Childrens' Society. Their project for this year is themed around families in crisis. When families are in crisis it is often the children who suffer. The Children's Society work includes family sessions to help with broken relationships or simply being a sympathetic ear to a child's problems:

Clare, aged 14, ran away from home and ended up sleeping on park benches, or in friend's gardens. In the end, Clare was so frustrated and alone, she took an overdose of sleeping tablets. Luckily, Clare recovered and found some stability at The Children's Society project in Birmingham. Here she was assigned a mentor who began to build a positive relationship between them – something that had become alien to Clare. The new stability, along with finding a children's home where she felt more comfortable, has given Clare the confidence and motivation to get her life back on track. Now at 18, she lives independently in her own flat and has got a job.


We pictured the meek mild creatures where They dwelt in their strawy pen, Nor did it occur to one of us there To doubt they were kneeling then.
