Aberdeen Journal 26th March 1927

Women's Boat Race - Oxford beat Cambridge in Novel Competition

A time race – the first of its kind – between the "undergraduates" of Oxford and Cambridge took place on the Isis at Oxford yesterday. A crowd of between 4000 and 5000 was attracted, including many undergraduates.

As racing is barred by the Oxford authorities, the crews had to row over the half mile course from the free ferry to the University boathouse at different times, and points were given for steadiness, rhythm, beginning and finish of strike, general impression and speed.

The judges, Messrs T H Henn, St Catherine's, Cambridge, and J G Jeffreys, Christchurch, Oxford, decided that the crews were equal in points on style, etc, so that the race resolved itself into one of time.

Cambridge were first to row, and their time was returned at 3 minutes 51 seconds. Oxford rowed a much livelier and rather faster stroke, and their time was returned as 3 minutes 25 seconds.

Thus Oxford were returned the winners.
