Badsey Flower Show 2018

This year's Badsey Flower Show takes place on Saturday July 28 on the Recreation Ground, Sands Lane, Badsey.

One of the main acts in the show arena will be "Bubbleinc", an entertaining and interactive family show which, as the name suggests, creates an array of show-stopping bubbles. The team creates all sorts of bubbles including giant bubbles, clouds of billions of bubbles, square bubbles, smoke filled bubbles, bouncing bubbles and even 'flat bubbles.' Bubbleinc has achieved 10 Guinness World Records.



Other entertainment on the day includes an agility and skills display by **Stunt Dogs**, Evesham's **United Dance Academy**, and the crowning of the **Evesham** Carnival King and Queen. Mojo the Dog, UK TV star and Guinness World Record holder will also be along on the day and a vintage RAF Dakota will fly past.

In addition, Lizzie's Busy Bus, a climbing wall, a bouncy castle, the Life in the Rainforest exhibition, chainsaw carving demonstrations and lots of food, gift and craft stalls will be on the showground.

The gates will be open from 1pm until 5pm, with entry priced at £3, £2 for OAPs, or £1 for children.


Badsey Carnival Saturday 11th August

Saturday 11th August will see the third "revived" Badsey Carnival There will be a procession of floats leaving from the Remembrance Hall at noon.




The procession travels through the heart of Badsey, ending up at the Community and Sports Club.

Some news about Badsey First School

Badsey First School has been going through significant changes in recent months. Aesthetically, you may have noticed the beautiful new fencing around the front of the school, but it is inside the classrooms that the most exciting developments are happening. In September, the school will be joining a small multi-academy trust: The Gloucestershire Learning Alliance. The GLA is a group of five schools (Bishops Cleeve Primary, Springbank Primary, Longford Park Primary and Rowanfield Infants & Juniors) who have a strong reputation for enabling children to exceed their potential. The GLA has actually been supporting Badsey since February 2018, and a Local Authority external review at the end of June was able to report on how... "The school's new leadership team is taking effective action to improve the school. They have brought about rapid change which is ensuring the children already receive a much improved education and importantly a greater understanding of the learning process." The new academic year in September is certainly an exciting time for all involved with the school!

Please pop in to see the new Head of School Mr Jon Moss if you want to learn more about the GLA or, importantly, help educate him on the local traditions and histories which have enriched the childhoods and educations of generations of Badsey First School pupils.

Work should soon be completed providing defibrillator units at 5 points in the Parish: Aldington, Remembrance Hall, Community & Sports Club, Round of Gras and the Spar shop. We hope not to see much use, but it is reassuring to have them in place!

Parish Council details and Contacts

The Council meets on the third Wednesday of every month except August at 7.30 pm in the Remembrance Hall. Rarely, circumstances may cause us to change date or venue. Agendas are posted with three clear business days between the day of posting and the day of the meeting. Notice boards are at Station Road, Blackminster; Round of Gras; Spar shop; Bowers Hill and Aldington. Draft minutes of meetings are posted at the Spar shop and online, final minutes of meetings are also posted, and all documents are available online at the Worcestershire County Council website. (Easily found by googling Badsey Parish Council.) Council reps play an active part in other groups, such as the Remembrance Hall, the Community Club and Badsey Relief in Need Charity.

We welcome residents and every meeting begins with a Public Forum of 10 minutes during which residents may speak. Residents may be present throughout meetings but may not contribute to discussions other than during the Public Forum. There are sub-committees for particular purposes (e.g. Planning; Events) which all report to the main Council. District and County Councillors as well as West Mercia Police are represented or send reports. Why not come along?
