


Entries will be judged in early December and the award made on the 14th of December at the Christmas Carols evening.

### **Planning Issues**

The South Worcestershire Development Plan Review is under way. Public Consultation is from **5th November** to **17th December 2018** and residents who are interested are advised to visit the Wychavon.gov.uk website. It is important that residents make their own comments to Wychavon when they are affected by an application. Mike Gwynn, our Planning Committee Chairman, writes to explain how the process works:

The Parish Council's planning committee includes six members of the Parish

Council and has its own chairperson. Its role is to consider and comment on planning applications made to Wychavon District Council relevant to the parish. New planning applications are notified by Wychavon via the Parish Clerk and members of the committee are asked to comment with a recommendation for approval or refusal. Further information about each application is obtained from Wychavon's website, which is also accessible to the general public. This information should include location details, plans, various reports such as Highways, exposure to flooding, presence of bats etc. and comments made by members of the public. The planning committee forms a view as to the desirability of the development, which may be a simple house extension or alteration, a new property or estate of houses. The committee takes into account the impact on the local environment, roads and services and whether the development is inside the South Worcestershire Development Plan or otherwise. It will make reasoned objections as necessary.

In the 12 month period May 2017 to April 2018, approximately 50 applications were considered. In only a small proportion of cases was a recommendation for refusal made.. The vast majority of applications relate to house extensions. The main areas of concern are building outside the South Worcestershire Development Plan and impact of a development on local roads and services.

It must be borne in mind that the view of the Parish Council planning committee represents just **one** voice. The actual decision is made by the Wychavon Planning Committee, which will take into account the view of the Parish Council alongside the views of its own experts, neighbours and other interested members of the public. The Parish Council does therefore also have a role in communicating planning applications to the parishioners so that they can also make Wychavon aware of their views.

#### **Village Planting**

Thank you to the parish councillors and to members of the public for taking part in the planting of daffodils around the village on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> November. Look out for the flowers in early spring 2019! It is hoped to expand the planting over future years.

#### **Bins**

Thank you to the residents that have suggested locations for new dog poo bins, these have now been installed at The Parks, Aldington and outside Maybush Gardens, Bretforton Road.

#### **Speed Enforcement Measures**

Following concerns expressed by residents, a new VAS post will be installed to regular have a VAS (vehicle activated sign) device on it at the entrance to Badsey along Badsey Road. The 30mph speed extension is due to come into force in February 2019 and when it does 'dragons teeth;' markings will be installed at each end of the B4035 into Badsey by Highways and funded by the parish council. The PC is also working with safer roads partnership and Highways to increase the number of motorcycle speed check sites in Badsey.

### Village Barn Dance 2019


Following a highly successful Barn Dance in March this year, we will be running another evening in March 2019.

#### Parish Council details and Contacts

The Council meets on the third Wednesday of every month except August at 7.30 pm in the Remembrance Hall. Rarely, circumstances may cause us to change date or venue. Agendas are posted with three clear business days between the day of posting and the day of the meeting. Notice boards are at Station Road, Blackminster; Round of Gras; Spar shop; Bowers Hill and Aldington. Draft minutes of meetings are posted at the Spar shop and online, final minutes of meetings are also posted, and all documents are available online at the Worcestershire County Council website. (Easily found by googling Badsey Parish Council.) Council reps play an active part in other groups, such as the Remembrance Hall, the Community Club and Badsey Relief in Need Charity.

We welcome residents and every meeting begins with a Public Forum of 10 minutes during which residents may speak. Residents may be present throughout meetings but may not contribute to discussions other than during the Public Forum. There are sub-committees for particular purposes (e.g. Planning; Events) which all report to the main Council. District and County Councillors as well as West Mercia Police are represented or send reports.
