

2019 Flower Show turns up the heat!

The 117th Badsey Flower Show takes place on **Saturday 20th July** on the Recreation Ground, Sands Lane. And this year the event organisers are promising a hot show!

The main entertainment attraction on the day will be fire performer Simon Chainey. Simon is the founder of FLAME, a group of performers specialising in high-energy street performance fire shows.

Committee member, Adrian Barradell said, "This year's Badsey Flower Show promises something eye-catchingly different with our fire performer. "There will also be lots of other quality entertainments and this includes a memorial RAF Hurricane flypast (weather and RAF commitments allowing). "It is a fun, family day out for a very affordable entrance fee."

Other arena entertainment on the day includes The Shirley Pipe Band, United Dance Academy and Badsey School Choir. Also on the showground will be the usual large marquee of exhibits and a great mix of sideshows, stalls and food and drink. In addition, playing live will be The Shipston Town Band.

Gates open at **1pm** and the afternoon will end at **5pm**. Entry costs **£3 (or £2 OAPs and £1 children)**.

At the club there will be stalls, rides, BBQ, gin bar, bar, displays, tug of war, music until late, fire engine etc., etc.

Planning Update

Between May 2018 and April 2019 the Parish Council was asked to consider 32 planning applications, down from 48 in the previous 12 months. 29 were approved by Wychavon District Council, 1 was refused and 2 are pending.

Significantly, 2 appeals against planning refusals were dismissed - namely the Neuk development behind 3 Bretforton Rd which was a proposal for 60 homes and 4 homes on land near 90 Bretforton Rd.

18 of the approved applications were for extensions or alterations. Others included a cattery at Blackminster, replacement of polytunnels, a new stable, 20 holiday homes at Aldington Sidings and a 2-plot traveller site on the existing Blossom Hill site.

Planting initiative

The Council is hoping to enhance the parish greens and verges and we are looking for your ideas to do this. We have introduced planters at all entrances of the villages and, with the help of residents, we started our annual bulb planting in October 2018 which will continue again this autumn. Another suggestion is to plant verges with wild meadow planting and leave them uncut. Images of this have recently been reported in national press.

We would also like residents to take part in planting ready for spring. The Parish Council wishes to celebrate the efforts people in the villages of Badsey and Aldington put into creating their garden displays of spring flowers. In 2020 a competition "Best Spring Garden" will be judged for the first time. The entry can be for a front or rear garden, big or small, and an award will be made to the 'most creative display of spring flowers'. Entry forms will be available from the Spar Shop in January. Judging will take place during the week starting 16th March depending on the weather and the winner will be announced at the Flower Show next year.

Parish Council details and Contacts

The Council meets on the third Wednesday of every month except August at 7.30 pm in the Remembrance Hall. Rarely, circumstances may cause us to change date or venue. Agendas are posted with three clear business days between the day of posting and the day of the meeting. Noticeboards are at Station Road, Blackminster; Round of Gras; Spar shop; Bowers Hill and Aldington. Draft minutes of meetings are posted at the Spar shop and online, final minutes of meetings are also posted, and all documents are available online at badseypc.uk, our website. Council reps play an active part in other groups, such as the Remembrance Hall, the Community Club and Badsey Relief in Need Charity.

We welcome residents and every meeting begins with a Public Forum of 10 minutes during which residents may speak. Residents may be present throughout meetings but may not contribute to discussions other than during the Public Forum. There are sub-committees for particular purposes (e.g. Planning; Events) which all report to the main Council. District and County Councillors as well as West Mercia Police are represented or send reports.
