
Christmas starts at The Wheatsheaf!

Exciting plans at the Rec Club

Under Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 contributions can be sought from developers towards the costs of providing community and social infrastructure, the need for which has arisen as a result of many new developments that have taken place in Badsey and Aldington.

With circa £500,000 available and allocated, the Parish Council are working closely with Badsey Community and Sports Club and Wychavon District Council to look at various improvements to the Club's facilities. These include a new entrance lobby, additional multi-use changing rooms, a new cricket pavilion, an extension to the main function room and storage facilities, a new gymnasium, new disability toilets and changing facilities, additional meeting rooms and kitchen facilities.



All of this is to open up the facilities available to a wider Badsey clientele. Any new roof areas will be fitted with the latest solar panels, with energy efficiency being at the forefront of the design. Finally, to eliminate the wafts of stagnant air from the outdated and under sized "cesspit", the Club will be connected to the main sewer.

When the project is finished, it will enable the Club to move into the 21st century, offering first class facilities to all that use it.

Grit and salt bins

As the weather becomes colder, a reminder about the location of grit bins in the villages, which are refilled as necessary by the County Council. If you notice the level in a bin needs topping up, please bring this to the attention of the Clerk, Andrea Evans. Bins are located as follows: Station Road Blackminster near railway bridge; Willersey Road, after Badsey sign; Synehurst, right hand side on junction; Aldington junction; Aldington, in horseshoe.




Land Project update





Thank you to all residents who took part in any way in our extensive consultation process over our proposed land purchase scheme. Understandably, there was a widespread desire to know the location of the land and, with the process now at an advanced stage, we feel it is now right to let residents know that the land is a piece of over 11 acres situated on the Willersey Road opposite Pear Tree Corner on the Badsey side of Bowers Hill, at present owned by the Diocese of Worcester. We expect our pre-planning consultation to be completed shortly and

completion of the purchase will follow. Our Legacy Grant application is being considered by Wychavon and we will know the outcome in March. Watch the website and Facebook page for further updates.



Parts of Badsey & Aldington were badly affected by flooding in recent weeks. Drivers: please exercise caution especially when driving on Badsey Lane to and from Knowle Hill. This unfortunate driver had to abandon the vehicle. Only the County Council Highway Authority is empowered to close roads, but the Parish Council is acquiring some "Flood Warning" signs which can be used to alert drivers.

Once again the weather took many by surprise and some households suffered. Wychavon were not quick to respond with sandbags, but for future reference please note that the Parish Council now has a small stock for emergency use. Contacts for the Clerk and Chairman are on the back page.

South Worcestershire Development Plan

The 2021 South Worcestershire Development Plan (SWDP) is being put together by the three councils forming South Worcestershire, namely Malvern Hills, Worcester City and Wychavon. Its purpose is to ensure that future development within the area is predictable and managed as effectively as possible given the requirements imposed by central Government to cater for a growing population, smaller average households and affordability, as well as employment needs.

Specifically this means building another 14,000 new homes and providing 169 hectares of employment land by 2041, in addition to the 28,000 homes (of which over half have been built) and 300 hectares by 2030 provided for by the 2016 SWDP.

The Government requires all councils to review local plans every 5 years. Failure to do so would mean councils losing control over where development takes place, making it much more difficult to prevent building on inappropriate sites.

In the course of preparing the SWDP more than 900 sites have been assessed. The recommendations include:

A new town at Worcestershire Parkway providing 5000 homes by 2041; A new town at Throckmorton Airfield providing 2000 homes by 2030; Expansion of Rushwick providing 1000 homes from 2030 once a new rail station has been secured; 3280 homes in the towns of Worcester, Droitwich, Malvern, Pershore, Tenbury Wells and including 200 in Evesham; 900 homes in Wychavon villages plus 390 in Malvern Hills; 273 hectares of employment land

In the parish of Badsey & Aldington half a dozen sites were assessed for housing development. Two sites have been selected -

Land off Bretforton Road between the existing Kingshurst Gardens and Maybush Gardens estates

Land adjacent to the Fothersway estate off Brewers Lane

It must be emphasised that allocation of this land does **not** mean that the normal planning process is bypassed. Any proposed development on this land still has to go through this process to ensure that it is properly designed and appropriate for housing needs.

The SWDP review allows for **consultation** on preferred options **until 5pm on 16th December 2019**. If anyone wishes to make their views known they should do so as follows:

Now that our scheme is active we are well placed to offer advice to others as they set up and run their own localised schemes all of which will benefit from the support of the Parish Council, the local police and others. It does not have to be just about crime, it can focus on any local issues including flood warning, loneliness, vulnerability and so much more. Neighbourhood Watch helps us make safer and friendlier communities."

There will be a short session in January, organised by the PC for volunteers to meet each other and have input in how to get the scheme up and running and how it would best suit Badsey, Aldington and Blackminster.

District and County Councillors as well as West Mercia Police are represented or send reports.
