Dear Sir

Having made a careful inspection of your  
church tower we now beg to submit to you  
alternative estimates for such a clock as  
we should deem suitable for it — Our clock  
would be of the very finest construction and  
finish and generally to the designs of Lord  
Grimthorpe (the great authority on such clocks)  
and we should guarantee it to maintain  
true time with less variation than 3 seconds  
a week and keep it in order free of charge  
for two years except the winding which  
would be done by the clerk or sexton. Such  
a clock would be an absolute "standard"

for the timekeeping of the district — We should  
place the clock in the tower that none of  
the bell ropes would be interfered with, nor  
would the central trap door be covered by  
any of the clock parts.

We may say that we made the new great clock  
for St Paul's Cathedral and many other important  
ones and at the present time we are making  
large clocks and chimes for Warwick parish  
church, Macclesfield (christ) church, Portsmouth  
Naval Barracks, Blaygowrie H. F. church, Timberfield  
church, Shilldon church, Woodmasey church,  
East Ham Town Hall, Retford Town Hall, Buckley  
church (Mrs Gladstone's memorial) and many others.

### Estimate I

We hereby offer to make a clock and fix  
it complete in Badsey church, to show time  
with new hands on the old dial which we  
should repaint and gild, to strike the hours.

*minutary power*

upon the largest bell, to be fitted with all the latest improvements, to have apparatus to continue the action of the clock during winding to have a small dial on the movement by which the external hands would be regulated and set to time.

*frame*

The main frame would be of one solid iron casting planed smooth and true with all the various wheels, levers and other working parts so arranged upon it that any separate part might be removed without disturbing the remainder.

*wheels*

All the wheels would be made according to the recommendations of Lord Grimthorpe - the teeth being carefully shaped so as to work into each other with perfect smoothness.

*arbor*

All the pinion arbors would be of the best cast steel properly hardened and

~~tempered~~

~~1000~~ Steel wire ropes would be used to carry the weights working over large grooved iron pulleys and wrought iron barrels.

Pendulum

The pendulum would be a cylindrical one with heavy bob fitted with screw clutch suspension - a hardened and tempered steel spring - an ordinary screw regulator and an auxiliary regulator of small weights for delicate adjustments

Bushes &c

All the bushes and bearings would be of the best gun metal or hard brass properly turned and fitted

Dial

The present dial would be properly painted and gilded.

Hands

New hands would be provided - made of copper properly hammered and stiffened and counterpoised inside the tower by adjustable

~~balance~~

The hammers for striking the bell would be mounted in iron frames - with suitable steel spring and bolted to the bell frame so as not to interfere with the ringing of the bells.

*Painting*

All the iron and steel work of the clock (except acting surfaces which would be polished) would be properly painted and varnished and all the gun metal wheels, bushes &c would be polished and lacquered.


*Cost*

The entire cost of the clock, complete and fixed inclusive of all carriage and travelling expenses, clockmakers time during fixing but exclusive of any woodwork or builders work required during fixing would be £78



a clock same as Estimate I but having

a clock same as Estimate I but having in addition "Lemmyson" chimes playing upon the 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> bells according to the following music would be £138.
