As will be seen by the above notice, the Bazaar is fixed for August 21st, and we sincerely hope all those interested in Wickhamford Church will help us to make it a success. The restoration of Wickhamford Church has been long hanging over our heads, and was a very necessary work. We are still in debt about £100 for the work already done, and there are other things which ought to be done as soon as possible. The stone work of the Tower needs considerable repair, and the heating apparatus is still in a very unsatisfactory condition, and must be attended to at a considerable cost before the winter comes on. We trust all our readers will see the necessity of helping us in this matter.

At the Bazaar there will be several stalls of useful and fancy articles as well as a refreshment stall.

A Theatrical Entertainment has been arranged by Lady Blomfield for the afternoon, at 3.30 p.m., and a Concert will be given in the evening. A golf croquet competition is being organised by Mrs. Adkins of Littleton, and a Ping Pong contest by Miss Horsman, both of which ought to be very popular. A good band will be in attendance, and there will be fireworks, illuminations, and dancing in the evening. Boating on the lake ought also to be a great

attraction. We shall be very much obliged if our readers will send us any articles for sale at the stalls, or gifts of tea, sugar, cake, bread, butter, etc., for the refreshment stalls.

Mrs. Idiens, Mrs. and Miss Pethard are arranging for the Wickhamford Stall, Mrs. Savory has undertaken to provide a stall from Aldington, and we hear the people of Aldington are taking a great interest in it and working hard for their stall. Mrs. Price will have a Badsey stall, and Miss Price of Oxford has promised to come to us again, and will have a stall as she did at our last Bazaar. Mrs. Sladden will provide a Sweet and Toy Stall, and Miss H. Ashwin will have a Fish Pond.

We thank these and many other Parishioners and Friends who are doing so much to help us.

As we are writing, the Annual Flower Show is being held. There is a very good display of flowers, fruit, vegetables, etc., and the table decorations, and bouquets are very much admired. The weather has happily turned out most satisfactory, and we hope the Show will be a success in every way.
