

WICKHAMFORD PARISH ROOM.

The long-talked-of Parish Room is at last an accomplished fact, and the opening ceremony has been definitely fixed for Tuesday, February 12th. As we announced some months ago, it was the original intention of the late Captain Lord's family to give the site and £150 towards the building of the room. Recognising, however, the difficulty there would be in raising the necessary balance, the original donors decided to relieve the parish of all responsibility in the matter, and they have now very generously made a free gift of both land and building, at an expense to themselves of about £,200. Mr. Arthur Lord has also provided timber for fencing and gravel for path-making, whilst the labour involved in fencing and laying out the grounds, as well as all additional material, has been gratuitously found by Mr. G. Pethard, Mr. Lees-Milne, Mr. Hooper-Ingledew, Mr. Newman, Mr. R. Taylor, Mr. G. Agg, Mr. J. Agg, jun., Mr. Winnett, and Messrs. G. and V. Pethard. Chairs, tables, lamps, etc. have been provided out of a fund of f,10 2s. 6d. subscribed as follows: - Christ Church, £2; Mr. Lees-Milne, £2; the Vicar, £2; Mr. Hooper-Ingledew, £1; Mr. Newman £1; Mr.

The opening ceremony will be performed by Mrs. Arthur Lord on February 12th, when a tea will be given to all the children of the parish, to be followed by an entertainment. JUPITER'S MOONS AND THE CHURCH CLOCK.

Observation of Jupiter's Second Satellite, January 29th.

Reappearance from Eclipse took place at 8hrs. 5m. 27sec Greenwich Mean Time at 8hrs. 5m. 59sec. Badsey Church Clock. Badsey Church Clock 32sec. fast.

Observation of Jupiter's First Satellite, January 30th.

Reappearance from Eclipse took place at 8hrs. im. 22sec. Greenwich Mean Time at 8hrs. im. 56sec. Badsey Church Clock. Badsey Church Clock 34 sec. fast.

An observation on January 18th showed the clock to be 26sec, slow. The clock was then regulated but the hands were not touched. The foregoing observations were taken with a 31in Refractor, Power 63.

N.B.—The clock time is taken from the first stroke of the hour.

NOTES AND NEWS.
