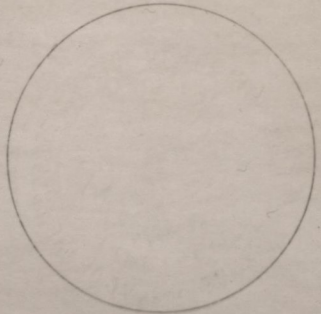
Fanny Marshall of The Wheatsheaf Inn aforesaid, Widow the Relict of deceased, the sole Executrix named in the said Will _____


